

Job's Nursery Berry Detailed List

Blackberry, Chester (Thornless)

Fruit: Large, sweet with very good flavor. Handles hot weath **Harvest:** Late Season

Uses: Fresh eating, jams, jellies and pie **Growth Habit:** Very vigorous, thornless, semi erect canes

Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun

Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 5

Comments May be trained on a trellis for picking ease. Resistant to cane blight.

Blackberry, Dirksen (Thornless)

Fruit: Large, Black, great flavor with a good sweetness to it. **Harvest:** Mid season

Uses: Used for fresh eating, jams, jellies **Growth Habit:** Semi-Errect canes

Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun

Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 5

Comments May be trained on a trellis for easier picking. Resistant to anthracnose, leaf spot, and powdery mildew. Ripens 2 weeks earlier than Black Satin.

Blackberry, Marion

Fruit: Large, bright black and excellent flavor of a tangy sweet **Harvest:** Mid Season

Uses: Fresh eating, jams and preserves **Growth Habit:** Vigorous, thorny plant on strong canes

Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun

Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 7

Comments May be trained on a trellis or spiraled around a stake. Classed a Zone 7 but grows well in all winters in Tri-Cities

Blackberry, Triple Crown (Thornless)

Fruit: Large and very flavorful. **Harvest:** Late Season

Uses: Fresh eating, jams, jellies and pie **Growth Habit:** Very vigorous, thornless, semi erect canes

Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun

Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 5

Comments May be trained on a trellis for picking ease. Resistant to cane blight.

Blueberry, Bluecrop

Fruit: Large, firm, light blue fruit, excellent flavor **Harvest:** Mid Season

Uses: Fresh eating, preserves, baking, fr **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 feet vigorous upright growth

Spacing: 6 to 8 feet apart **Exposure:** Partial Shade with Wind Pr

Water Requirements: Medium to High Water User **Zones:** 4

Comments Cross with another Blueberry variety for heavier fruit sets. Prefers acidic soil. Protect from Winds in Tri-Cities.

Blueberry. Bluerav

Fruit: Large blue fruit, very sweet aromatic flavor **Harvest:** Early to Mid Season
Uses: Fresh eating, preserves, baking **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 feet
Spacing: 6 to 8 feet apart **Exposure:** Partial Shade with Wind Pr
Water Requirements: Medium to High Water User **Zones:** 2 to 9, 14 to 17
Comments Cross with another Blueberry variety for heavier fruit sets. Prefers acidic soil. Protect from Winds in Tri-Cities. Tolerates Heat.

Blueberry. Chandler

Fruit: Large blue fruit, very sweet aromatic flavor **Harvest:** Mid to Late Season
Uses: Great for desserts and freezing **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 feet vigorous upright growth
Spacing: 6 to 8 feet apart **Exposure:** Partial Shade with Wind Pr
Water Requirements: Medium to High Water User **Zones:** 4
Comments Cross with another Blueberry variety for heavier fruit sets. Prefers acidic soil. Protect from Winds in Tri-Cities. Six Week Harvest Period.

Blueberry. Duke

Fruit: Medium to large fruit, mildly sweet **Harvest:** Early
Uses: Fresh eating, preserves, baking **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 feet
Spacing: 6 to 8 feet apart **Exposure:** Partial Shade with Wind Pr
Water Requirements: Medium to High Water User **Zones:** 5
Comments Cross with another Blueberry variety for heavier fruit sets. Prefers acidic soil. Protect from Winds in Tri-Cities. Late blooming protects crop from Late Spring Frosts.

Currant. Crandall

Fruit: Clusters of large, black berries with a sweet tart flavor **Harvest:** Mid July
Uses: Excellent for jams, juice and syru **Growth Habit:** Bushy, 3 to 5 feet
Spacing: 4 feet for a hedge **Exposure:** Full Sun to Partial Shade
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 3
Comments Has 5 times the vitamin C of oranges! Removes stems older than two years.

Currant. Primus White

Fruit: White bearies. Very Sweet for currants. **Harvest:** Mid July
Uses: Jams, jellies and baking **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 feet tall and 2 to 5 feet wide
Spacing: 2 to 5 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 3
Comments Heavy bearing and vigorous. Prune out 3 year old canes.

Currant. Red Lake

Fruit: Large clusters of dark red medium sized berries **Harvest:** July
Uses: Jams, jellies and baking **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 feet tall and 2 to 5 feet wide
Spacing: 2 to 5 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 3
Comments Heavy bearing and vigorous. Prune out 3 year old canes.

Gooseberrv. Captivator

Fruit: Large, teardrop-shaped, sweet, pink to red **Harvest:** Late July
Uses: Fresh eating, baking and caning **Growth Habit:** Semi-thorn less 3 to 5 foot bush
Spacing: 4 to 6 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 2
Comments Semi-thornless. Heavy bearing and vigorous. Prune out 3 year old canes.

Gooseberrv. Hinnomaki red

Fruit: Large red fruit, with an outstanding flavor. **Harvest:** Late July
Uses: Fresh eating, baking and canning **Growth Habit:** Semi-thorn less 3 to 5 foot bush
Spacing: 4 to 6 feet **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 4-6
Comments Semi-thornless. Heavy bearing and vigorous. Prune out 3 year old canes.

Gooseberrv. Pixwell

Fruit: Medium sized, oval shaped fruit, tart flavor **Harvest:** August through September
Uses: Pies, jams and jelly **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 foot tall, very hardy
Spacing: 4 to 6 feet **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 3
Comments Semi-thornless. Heavy bearing and vigorous. Prune out 3 year old canes.

Grape. Flame Seedless (Table)

Fruit: Clusters of medium sized seedless red fruit **Harvest:** Early to Mid Season
Uses: Fresh Eating and Rasins **Growth Habit:** Vigorous, hardy and productive vines
Spacing: 6 to 8 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun with good air flow
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 6
Comments Prefers well drained sandy loam soil. Thin annually to provide better berry quality. Cane or Spur Pruning.

Grape. Interlaken (Seedless Table)

Fruit: Crisp, meaty, sweet flesh, pleasant tangy flavor **Harvest:** Very Early
Uses: Fresh eating, raisins **Growth Habit:** Vigorous, disease resistant vines
Spacing: 6 to 8 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun with good air flow
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 5
Comments Prefers well drained sandy loam soil. Thin annually to provide better berry quality. Cane or Spur

Raspberry. Amitv (Everbearing)

Fruit: Large, firm, dark red berries **Harvest:** Everbearing
Uses: Fresh eating, freezing and canning **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 foot canes, nearly thornless
Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 4
Comments After first fall crop, remove top third. Then after spring crop thin cane completely out. Train on a trellis for picking ease. Dig out errant canes to control spread of plant.

Raspberry. Canby (Spring Crop)

Fruit: Light Red, large, good flavor **Harvest:** Late spring, early summer
Uses: Fresh eating, canning, freezing, c **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 foot canes, thornless
Spacing: 3 feet apart in rows **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 1 to 24
Comments After harvest, cut to the ground producing canes. Train on a trellis for picking ease. Dig out errant canes to control spread.

Raspberry. Fall Gold (Everbearing)

Fruit: Golden, large soft berries, conical shaped, very sweet **Harvest:** Everbearing
Uses: Fresh eating, canning, freezing, c **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 foot canes
Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 4
Comments After first fall crop, remove top third. Then after spring crop thin cane completely out. Train on a trellis for picking ease. Dig out errant canes to control spread of plant.

Raspberry. Heritage (Everbearing)

Fruit: Large, sweet, dark red berries with mild flavor. The #1 **Harvest:** Summer with heavy fall crop
Uses: Fresh eating, canning, freezing, pr **Growth Habit:** Very sturdy canes, seldom require support
Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun
Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 1 to 24
Comments After first fall crop, remove top third. Then after spring crop thin cane completely out. Train on a trellis for picking ease. Dig out errant canes to control spread of plant.

Raspberry. Indian Summer (Ever bearing)

Fruit: Medium to Large, tasty Red berries **Harvest:** Ever bearing

Uses: Fresh eating, preserves **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 foot canes

Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun

Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 1 to 24

Comments After first fall crop, remove top third. Then after spring crop thin cane completely out. Train on a trellis for picking ease. Dig out errant canes to control spread of plant. Good for heavy soils.

Raspberry. Munger (Black Cap)

Fruit: Large, plump shiny black berries. Good Flavor **Harvest:** Mid Season

Uses: Fresh eating, preserves **Growth Habit:** 4 to 6 foot canes

Spacing: 2 to 3 feet apart **Exposure:** Full Sun

Water Requirements: Medium Water User **Zones:** 5

Comments Most popular commercial black fruit variety.
